SOCCER NEW BRUNSWICK RULES & REGULATIONS

8.4. Provincial Club Championships

8.4.1. General

- 8.4.1.2. Soccer New Brunswick shall manage the operations of all provincial club championship competitions in accordance with the rules set out herein and the Canadian Soccer Association rules and regulations.
- 8.4.1.3. Soccer New Brunswick to announce sites for all provincial club championships at the Annual General Meeting of each year. All schedules will be determined by Soccer New Brunswick and said schedules shall be sent out to participating clubs no later than August 1st each year.
- 8.4.1.4. Each team shall be affiliated to a Club in Membership and registered by that Club with Soccer New Brunswick as an eligible team.
- 8.4.1.5. Each team wishing to qualify for a Provincial Club Championship must have competed in the provincial league or their regional qualifier during the current season. Where there is no league, an alternate solution will be determined in consultation with Soccer New Brunswick.
- 8.4.1.6. With the exception of the Master Provincial Championships, players competing in a provincial club championship must not be cup-tied i.e. have played in any other provincial competition. A player is deemed to be 'cup-tied' after taking part in one game of any provincial championship competition.
- 8.4.1.7 Every club attending provincial competitions must provide an official club point of contact for the competition in question.

8.4.2. Substitutions

- 8.4.2.1. In all U11, U12, youth provincial club championships and senior recreational provincial club championships (Van Horne, Wisdom, Michael Dunn Cups and Grand Masters), there are unlimited substitutions but these are limited to two (2) players at any one time at a stoppage in play and at the referee's discretion.
- 8.4.2.2. In all youth premier U13, U15 and U17 competitive provincial club championships, Challenge and Jubilee Cups, a maximum of five (5) substitutions shall be allowed in the whole game (including any overtime). Unlimited substitutions may be made at half-time, or at full-time before any overtime. A player who has been substituted is eligible to re-enter.
- 8.4.2.3. In all instances where the number of substitutions is limited, a substitute must report to the assistant referee giving his/her completed substitution slip, prior to participating in the game.
- 8.4.2.4. No substitutions shall be allowed for a player who has been ordered from the field of play for misconduct.









8.4.3. Duration of Games

8.4.3.1. The duration of all games shall be:

Masters – two (2) equal periods of thirty five (35) minutes each;

Senior A - two (2) equal periods of forty five (45) minutes each;

Senior B – two (2) equal periods of thirty five (35) each;

Under 18 - two (2) equal periods of forty (40) minutes each;

Under 17 - two (2) equal periods of forty (40) minutes each;

Under 16 - two (2) equal periods of forty (40) minutes each;

Under 15 – two (2) equal periods of thirty five (35) minutes each;

Under 13, 14 – two (2) equal periods of thirty five (35) minutes each;

Under 12 - two (2) equal periods of thirty (30) minutes each;

- 8.4.3.2. Notwithstanding 8.4.3.1, the duration of games may be altered at the discretion of Soccer New Brunswick.
- 8.4.3.3. There shall be no extra time played in round robin games.
- 8.4.3.4. Where a game is abandoned because of floodlight failure, weather and/or any outside influence and more than seventy percent (70%) of the game has been played then the result at the time of abandonment will be recorded as the final score.
- 8.4.3.5. Where a game is abandoned under 83.4.3.4 approved by Soccer New Brunswick representative, and the score is tied but the championship requires a result, this winner will be determined by the toss of a coin.

8.4.4. Extra time

- 8.4.4.1. Extra time of two (2) equal periods of fifteen (15) minutes each shall be played in quarter, semi and final games only. Overtime shall be played in its entirety (no golden goal).
- 8.4.4.2. In all competitions (or parts thereof) organized on a round-robin basis all games shall be played to regulation time only, except as specified below.

8.4.5. Round Robin

In the round-robin competition, three (3) points are awarded for a win and one (1) point for a tie.









8.4.6. Tie Breaking

8.4.6.1. In all championships (or parts thereof) organized on a knock-out basis, all games shall be played to a decision. If at the end of regulation time, the score is a tied, kicks from the penalty mark will be used to determine a winner.

8.4.6.2 In any three (3) team round robin, whether part or all of the championship, the third game shall be played to a decision in accordance with this rule, if the team not participating has zero points, has been suspended, or has withdrawn. In the event that the score is tied after regulation time, the taking of kicks from the penalty mark will be used to determine the winner. The team that eventually loses the game shall be awarded one point.

8.4.6.3. Three (3) points shall be awarded for a win and one (1) point for a tie (including the taking of kicks from the penalty mark). Standings shall be determined by points won at the completion of the round robin, with tie-breaking as outlined below.

8.4.6.4. The following criteria shall be used to determine the final standings:

8.4.6.4.1. Most points in all group matches

8.4.6.4.2. If two (2) teams are tied in points in all group matches:

8.4.6.4.2.1. Greater number of points in matches between the teams concerned (head to head competition).

8.4.6.4.2.2. Results for all group matches.

8.4.6.4.2.3. Greater goal difference in all group matches.

8.4.6.4.2.4. Greater number of goals scored in all group matches.

8.4.6.4.2.5. Kicks from the penalty mark as per FIFA Laws of the Game, at a time and place decided by the Soccer New Brunswick Representative.

8.4.6.4.3 Players under suspension are not eligible to participate; however this does not constitute the serving of any disciplinary suspension already awarded. The following must be used to completion if three (3) teams are tied in points in all group matches:

8.4.6.4.3.1 Greater goal difference in matches between the teams concerned. 8.4.6.4.3.2 Greater number of goals scored in all matches between the teams concerned.

8.4.6.4.3.3 Greater goal difference in all group matches.

8.4.6.4.3.4 Greater number of goals scored in all group matches

8.4.6.4.3.5 At a time and place decided by the Soccer New Brunswick Representative, a drawing of lots will determine 1st place between the teams concerned.

8.4.6.4.3.6 The remaining 2 teams will follow the format outlined in 8.4.6.4.b

8.4.7. Team Colors

When the colors of competing teams are similar, the home team shall use colors that are distinct from the colors of the opposition. The team whose name appears first on the schedule shall be considered the home team.









8.4.8. Game forms

Game forms - for each game in the competition, teams will be provided with a game sheet, which must be completed prior to commencement of the game and delivered to the referee. At the conclusion of the game, the game sheet and any referee reports must be returned immediately to the Soccer New Brunswick Representative by the game official.

8.4.9. Discipline

All disciplinary action resulting from ejections and cautions will be dealt with by Soccer New Brunswick.

- 8.4.9.1. A player who is dismissed (red card) or who receives two (2) cautions (yellow cards) within the same game shall serve a minimum one game suspension.
- 8.4.9.2. A player who accumulates three (3) cautions (yellow cards) over the course of a tournament shall serve a minimum one game suspension.
- 8.4.9.3. Misconduct involving team players and officials will be dealt with by Soccer New Brunswick.
- 8.4.9.4. All protests shall be submitted, in writing, within one hour of the game's conclusion and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 fee, made payable to Soccer New Brunswick.
- 8.4.9.5. Protests and appeals shall be dealt with by the Soccer New Brunswick Disciplinary Committee at whose discretion the fee may be forfeited, returned in part, or returned in full.
- 8.4.9.6. Protests based on a referee's discretionary decision shall not be entertained.
- 8.4.9.7 Any decision taken by this Committee on a protest shall be final and binding, as far as the competition is concerned.

8.4.10. Referee Payment

All referees and assistant-referees will be paid by Soccer New Brunswick. The Host Club shall go through the NBSRA Zone Coordinators to secure the officials. The Zone Coordinators will in turn, submit the names to the officials to Soccer New Brunswick by two (2) weeks prior to the Provincial Championships.

8.4.11. Call Ups

Teams participating in the provincial club championships shall be permitted to call up a maximum of three (3) players in accordance with Rule 6.0. All call ups must be approved by Soccer New Brunswick at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the start of said championships. Players called up may not be cup-tied.

8.4.12. Youth Competitions

8.4.12.1. Champions of the U15 and U17 Premier Provincial Club Championships shall represent New Brunswick at the National Club Championships at a time and place determined by the Canadian Soccer Association.









- 8.4.12.2. Only those teams participating in the New Brunswick Soccer League (NBSL) shall be permitted to compete in the Premier Provincial Club Championships. NBSL rules are subject to Soccer NB rules and regulations. In any conflict, Soccer NB rules and regulations take precedence.
- 8.4.12.3. In the U13, U15 and U18 divisions, one (1) team shall be permitted to represent each Region in each age category and gender of the Division 1 provincial club championships with the host region of the Division 1 provincial championships providing one (1) additional team.
- In U12, two (2) teams shall be permitted to represent each Region in each gender category. The host region as well as the winning region from the previous year will each have an additional team. Exceptions will be outlined in the Hosting Standards.
- 8.4.12.4. Regional representatives are to be determined based on a competition format agreed upon at a Regional Meeting of the Members of the respective regions. Competition format to be communicated to Soccer New Brunswick.
- 8.4.12.5. Clubs wishing to have teams participate in their respective Regional competition for the right to participate in the Division 1 Provincial Club Championships shall make application to their Regional Association. Each Regional Association must then notify Soccer New Brunswick by July 15th as to participation in each competition.
 - 8.4.12.5.1. Each club application to the Division 1 Provincial Championships shall include the submission of the Team Registration Form, Team Roster Form and a \$500.00 performance bond and \$250 Entry Fee.
- 8.4.12.6. Division 1 team performance bonds shall be returned, without interest, upon the respective teams' completion of the provincial championships and adherence to the code of conduct for Provincial Championships as outlined in the Provincial Guide. Teams who withdraw from the Division 1 Provincial Championships will forfeit their performance bond and \$250 entry fee.
- 8.4.12.7. All Under 11 and 12 Provincial Club Championships shall be played as 8-aside competitions in accordance with the 8-aside rules outlined herein.
- 8.4.12.8. Number of players eligible to compete:
 - 8.4.12.8.1. Premier competitions a maximum of twenty (20) players may be on the roster and dress for each game;
 - 8.4.12.8.2. Division 1 unlimited number of players may register and a maximum of twenty (20) may dress for each game;
 - 8.4.12.8.3. Under 11, 12 a maximum of sixteen (16) players may register and dress for each game.
- 8.4.13.9.3. Under 11, 12 a minimum of twelve (12) and a maximum of sixteen (16) players may register and dress for each game.









8.4.13. Senior Competitions

- 8.4.13.1. Soccer New Brunswick shall operate the following Senior Cup Competitions:
 - Challenge Cup Senior Men Competitive
 - Jubilee Cup Senior Women Competitive
 - Van Horne Cup Senior Men Recreational
 - Wisdom Cup Senior Women Recreational
 - Michael Dunn Cup Senior Men age 35+
 - Grand Masters Senior Men age 45+
- 8.4.13.2. Champions of the Challenge and Jubilee Cups shall represent New Brunswick at the National Club Championships at a time and place determined by the Canadian Soccer Association.
- 8.4.13.3. Only teams registered and playing in the NBPSL will be permitted to play for the Challenge or Jubilee Cups.
- 8.4.13.4. All teams participating in the NBPSL are automatically registered for the Challenge/Jubilee Cup playoffs and their seeding is determined by the regular season standings.
 - 8.4.13.4.1.1. In accordance with NBPSL Rule 8.5, final league standings will determine the team placements for the NBPSL Challenge/Jubilee Cup playoffs.
 - 8.4.13.4.1.2. The NBPSL Challenge/Jubilee Cup playoffs shall be held on dates established by the NBPSL Management Committee.
 - 8.4.13.4.1.3. In a 4-team league: the 4th place team will travel and play the 1st place team; the 3rd place team will travel and play the 2nd place team. The two winners will play for the NBPSL Challenge Cup/Jubilee Trophy (the highest seeded team will be the home team).
 - 8.4.13.4.1.4. In a 5-team league: the 5th place team will travel and play the 4th place team. The winner will travel and play the 1st pace team. The rest of the playoffs will follow the 4-team league format.
 - 8.4.13.4.1.5. In a 6-team league: the 1st and 2nd place teams will have a bye to the semi-finals. The 6th place team will travel and play the 3rd place team; the 5th place team will travel and play the 4th place team. The lowest remaining seed will travel and play the 1st place team; the highest remaining seed will travel and play the 2nd place team.
 - 8.4.13.4.1.6. In a 7-team league: the 7th place team will not make the playoffs and the other teams will follow the 6-team league playoff format.
 - 8.4.13.4.1.7. In a 8-team league: the playoffs will be split into two divisions: Tier 1 and Tier 2. Tier 1 will consist of team one through four and Tier 2 will consist of team five through eight. The 4team playoff format will be used for both divisions. Only the winner of Tier 1 will be the Challenge Cup/Jubilee Trophy Champion and will represent NB at the Senior Club Championships.









- 8.4.13.5. Notwithstanding Rule 8.4.14.1, each team may enter only one competition per season (except for the Masters and Grand Masters Cup) and must complete the entry form before the deadline, accompanied by the entry fee.
- 8.4.13.6. With the exception of Masters Teams and Grand Masters, each team must have competed in a league during the current season.
- 8.4.13.8. Players must be Canadian citizens, landed immigrants, have refugee status or be a full-time student7that has lived in the province for at least six (6) months prior to the competition.
- 8.4.13.8. All players participating in any of the Soccer New Brunswick provincial club championships must be registered with Soccer New Brunswick in accordance with the registration and transfer deadlines set out herein.
- 8.4.13.9. Number of players eligible to compete:
 - 8.4.13.9.1. Challenge & Jubilee Cups a maximum of twenty-five (25) players may be on the roster and twenty (20) may dress for each game;
 - 8.4.13.9.2. Van Horne, Michael Dunn, Masters, Grand Masters & Wisdom Cups a maximum of twenty-five (25) players may be on the roster and dress for each game.
- 8.4.13.10. Unless otherwise stipulated, herein, Challenge and Jubilee Cup formats will follow the structure outlined in the McCain NBPSL Rules and Regulations.
- 8.4.13.11. A fourth official is required for all Challenge/Jubilee Cup playoff games

8.4.14. Challenge Cup

- 8.4.14.1. The Challenge Cup shall be open to all Senior Men's teams duly registered and playing in the McCain NBPSL.
- 8.4.14.2. Teams may be asked to compete in preliminary rounds of the Challenge Cup at the discretion of the NBPSL LMC

8.4.14.3. Seeding

- 8.4.14.3.1. Seeding may result in home team advantage at the discretion of the Soccer New Brunswick Competitions Committee and/or Board of Directors.
- 8.4.14.3.2. The seeding for the Challenge Cup/Jubilee playoffs shall be determined after the completion of the NBPSL regular season.
- 8.4.14.3.3. If two or more provincial or inter-provincial leagues are being considered, determination of the higher level league shall be at the discretion of the Soccer New Brunswick Competitions Committee and/or Board of Directors.









- 8.4.14.3.4. Teams participating in regional or local leagues shall be seeded based on their performance in their respective leagues as of August 1st of the year of the competition subject to the following criteria:
 - (a) Teams shall be awarded one (1) point for a win and (1/2) point for a tie. The total number of points shall be divided by the total number of games played. The team with the highest percentage will be awarded the higher seeding.
 - (b) Total number of goals scored by the team shall be divided by the total number of games played. The team with the highest percentage will be awarded the higher seeding.
 - (c) Total number of goals conceded shall be subtracted by the total number of goals scored divided by the total number of games played. The team with the highest percentage will be awarded the higher seeding.
 - (d) The winner of a match between the two (2) teams tied in points shall be awarded the higher seeding. The location, date and time of the match shall be determined by Soccer New Brunswick.

8.6.3. Field of Play

- 8.6.3.1. Under 11, 12 Field Dimensions
 - 8.6.3.1.1. Length minimum of 55 and maximum of 75 meters
 - 8.6.3.1.2. Width minimum of 35 and maximum of 55 meters
 - 8.6.3.2. The Penalty Area shall be 10 meters in length and 25 meters in width.
 - 8.6.3.3. The Goal Area shall be 5 meters in length and 12 meters in width.
 - 8.6.3.4. The Centre Circle shall be a radius of 6 meters from the Centre Spot.
 - 8.6.3.5. The Penalty Shot Mark shall be 8 meters from the Goal Line.
 - 8.6.3.6. The Penalty Arc shall be 8 meters from the Penalty Shot Mark.
 - 8.6.3.7. The Corner Arc shall be 1 meter from the corner.
 - 8.6.3.8. Goal Size
 - 8.6.3.8.1. The standard goal size shall be Length − 18 feet Height − 6 feet









CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Soccer New Brunswick is committed to providing a safe and fun environment for athletes, team staff, officials, Soccer New Brunswick staff, parents and volunteers. Soccer New Brunswick is also committed to providing a sport environment that promotes equal opportunity and prohibits discriminatory practices. To ensure this atmosphere of safety, respect, equity and fun..

All participants are expected to:

- Act as ambassadors for Soccer New Brunswick, their Regional or Club Soccer Association, as well as the host Region or Club for the competition;
- Participate in the Provincial Championships in the spirit of fair play, cooperation and respect for others at all times;
- Respect the rules of the sport and Soccer New Brunswick Rules for Provincial Championships;
- Perform to their best ability in every competition and accept with pride the result their effort brings;
- Respect their opponents;
- Respect the directions and decisions of Soccer New Brunswick Representative and the Referee Coordinator;
- Be gracious in victory and defeat;
- Respect the rights of the residents of the Host Association and members from other regions and clubs;
- Regard participation in the Provincial Championships as a privilege;
- Conduct themselves in accordance with Soccer New Brunswick Code of Conduct to ensure that the Competitions take place in a safe environment, free from harassment and discrimination for all members;
- Be punctual for all official functions and activities.

Soccer is a game of respect. Respect means treating others in a way that you would like to be treated, including showing you care for their physical and emotional wellbeing.

In soccer, respect includes respect for yourself, your body, your team and other teams. It includes humility, selflessness and a willingness to appreciate others. It means treating people with integrity, being non-judgmental, and acknowledging the honor and dignity of others. Respect does not mean putting others down or treating anyone as a lesser person than you.

For players this means:

Treating those involved in the game, team staff, officials, team officials, managers, training staff, medical staff, volunteers, and other players in a respectful manner, including respecting them and appreciating their role in the game;

being concerned about the safety of others and avoiding injury. For team staff this means:

- treating all players with respect, those on your team, those on other teams and those you come into contact with for other reasons;
- teaching players to understand and respect the Laws of the Game and Soccer New Brunswick Rules for Provincial Championships;
- treating officials with respect;









- dealing with players in a positive manner;
- ensuring players are safe, including equipment and facilities;
- obtaining proper training and continuing to upgrade skills;
- acting in a professional manner at all times;
- treating parents with respect.

Soccer is also about having fun. All individuals involved in the game should strive to ensure that practices, games and other team events provide an opportunity for fun as well as competition.

Fair Play

Respect refers to a whole range of behaviors both on and off the field of play:

The participants shall:

- respect the dignity and spirit of all participants;
- treat all participants fairly and equitably;
- participate in a manner that ensures the safety of athletes, team staff and officials participating in the game;
- create positive, supportive soccer experiences for the purpose of building confidence, developing and improving skills and having fun;
- support the game by playing by the Laws of the Game and Soccer New Brunswick Rules for Provincial Championships in the spirit of the sport;
- display high personal standards and project a favorable image of the sport.

 - O U-13 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Penalty Shots
 - U-15 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Penalty Shots
 - U-17 2 x 40 minutes + 2x10 minutes + Penalty Shots
- Only those players listed on the official team roster are permitted to play.
- Each team will be given a copy of their team roster prior to the competition.
- The Soccer NB Representative responsible for the event will also have copies of the official rosters.
- Win = 3 points; Tie = 1 point
- Size 5 Balls are to be used during game play

Durée des matchs:

- Parties éliminatoires
 - o s13 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Coups de pieds de réparation.
 - o s15 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Coups de pieds de réparation.

3.2.1 **U-18**

Duration of Games:

- Round Robin 2 x 40 minutes:
- Elimination Games U-18 2 x 40 minutes + 2x10 minutes + Penalty Shots
- Only those players listed on the official team roster are permitted to play.
- Each team will be given a copy of their team roster prior to the competition.
- The Soccer NB Representative responsible for the event will also have copies of the official rosters.
- Win = 3 points; Tie = 1 point
- Size 5 Balls are to be used during game play

Durée des matchs:

- Ronde préliminaire 2 x 40 minutes
- Parties éliminatoires s18 2 x 40 minutes + 2x10 minutes + Coups de pieds de réparation.
- Les joueurs qui sont sur la liste des joueurs officiels de Soccer NB sont les seuls permis de participer au tournoi.
- Chaque équipe recevra une copie de la liste officielle avant la compétition.

- Round Robin 2 x 35 minutes;
- Elimination Games U-15 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Penalty Shots
- Only those players listed on the official team roster are permitted to play.
- Each team will be given a copy of their team roster prior to the competition.
- The Soccer NB Representative responsible for the event will also have copies of the official rosters.
- Win = 3 points; Tie = 1 point
- Size 5 Balls are to be used during game play

- Parties éliminatoires s15 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Coups de pieds de réparation.

- Round Robin 2 x 35 minutes;
- Elimination Games U-13 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Penalty Shots
- Only those players listed on the official team roster are permitted to play.
- Each team will be given a copy of their team roster prior to the competition.
- The Soccer NB Representative responsible for the event will also have copies of the official rosters.
- Win = 3 points; Tie = 1 point
- Size 5 Balls are to be used during game play

- Ronde préliminaire 2 x 35 minutes
- Parties éliminatoires s13 2 x 35 minutes + 2x5 minutes + Coups de pieds de réparations
